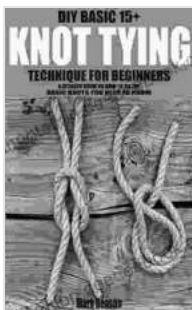

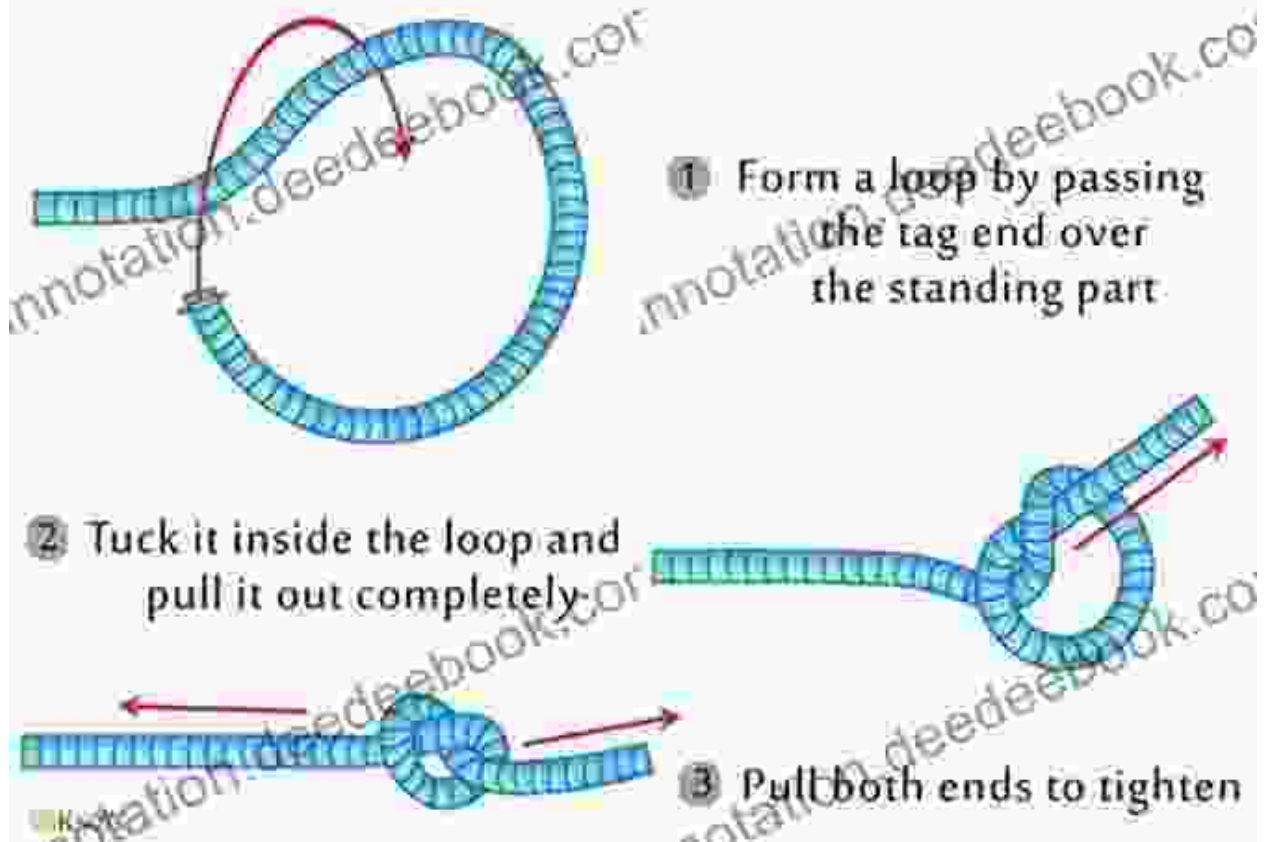

Tying a Double Figure 8 Knot

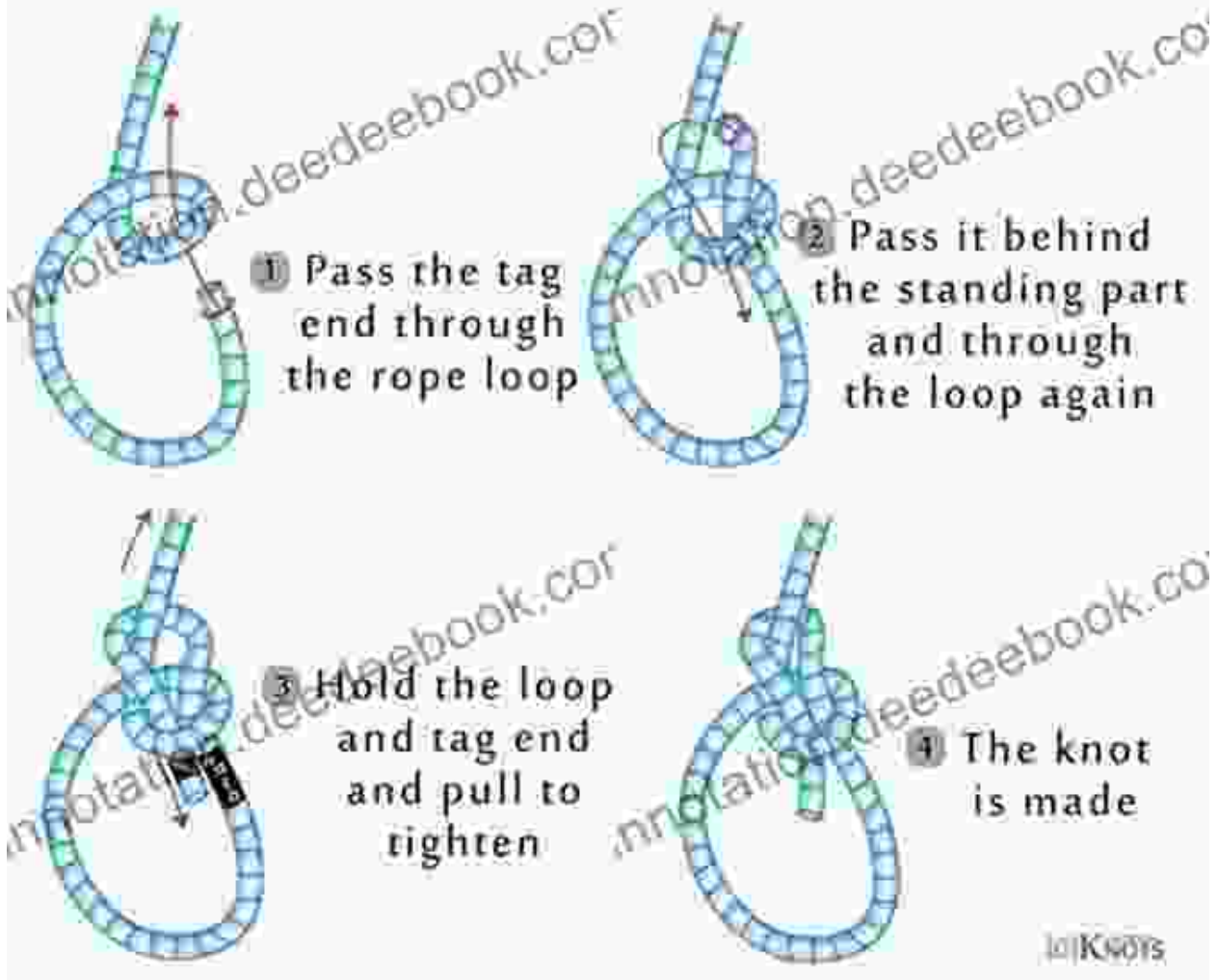

Bowline Knot

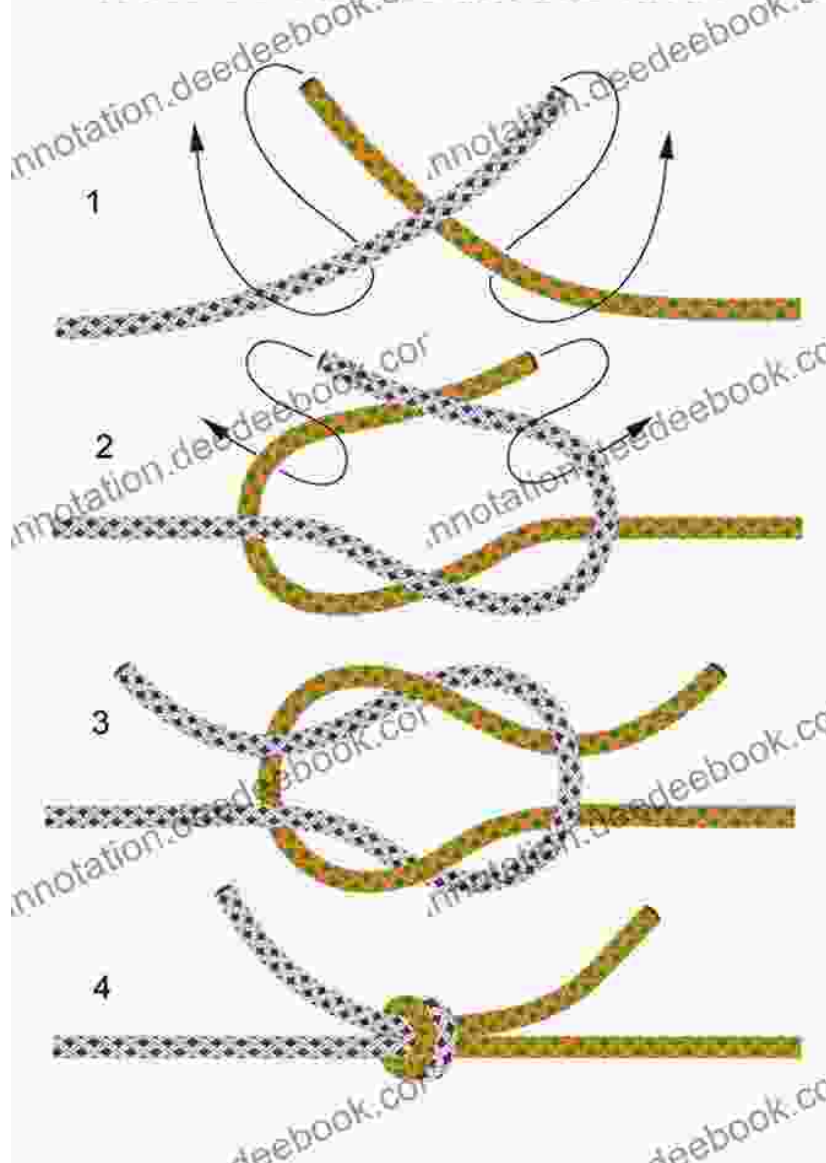
Bowline Knot Directions

3. Pass the working end of the rope under and through the loop.
4. Bring the working end back up and pass it over the standing part of the rope.
5. Insert the working end into the loop again and pull to tighten.

Square Knot

HOW TO TIE A SQUARE KNOT



- 1.
2. Cross the right end of the rope over the left.
3. Pass the left end under the right and up through the loop created.
4. Repeat the process with the left end going over the right.
5. Pull both ends to tighten the knot.

Note: The Square Knot is also known as the "reef knot," but be careful not to confuse it with the "granny knot," which is less secure.

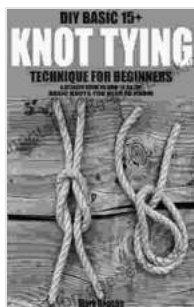
