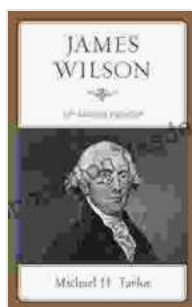
Early Life and Education

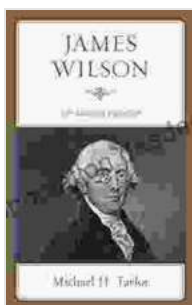

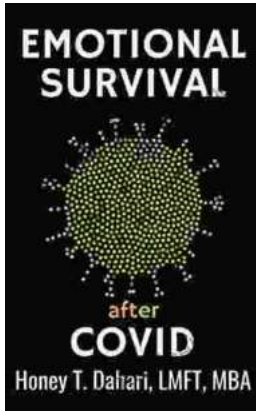
