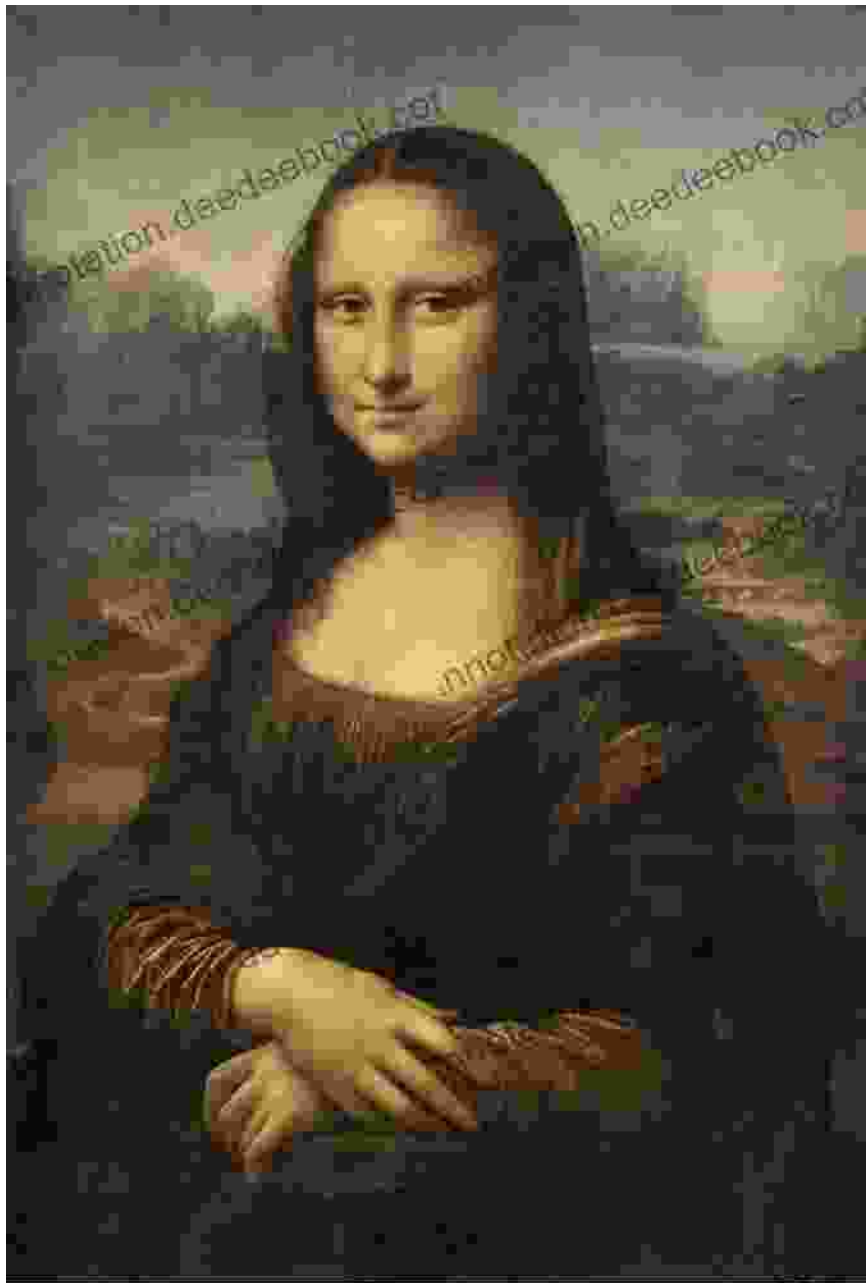

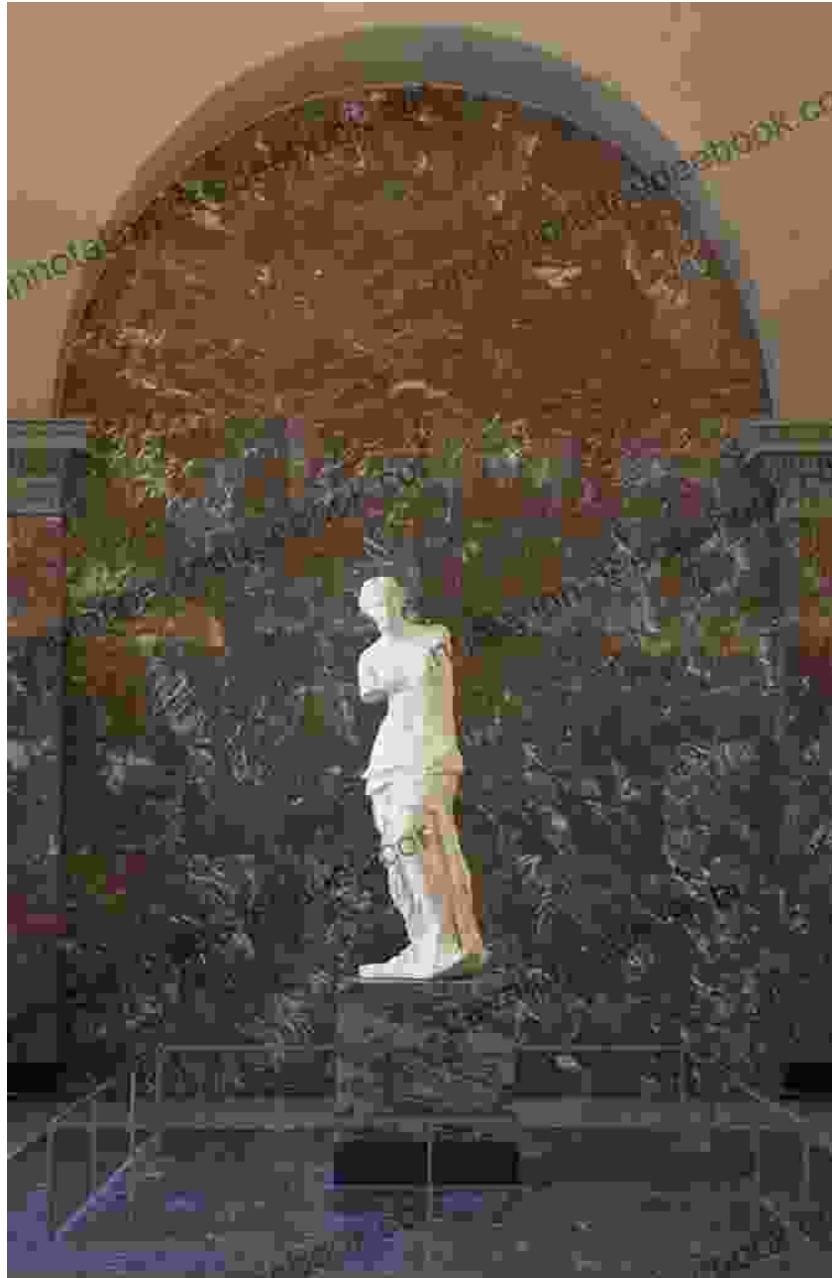

The Louvre is open every day of the week except for Tuesdays. The museum is open from 9am to 6pm on weekdays and from 9am to 9:45pm on weekends.

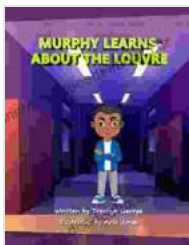
Tickets to the Louvre can be purchased online or at the museum's ticket office. There are different types of tickets available, so be sure to choose

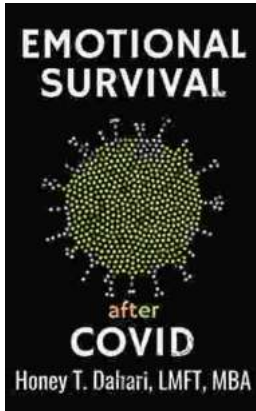
