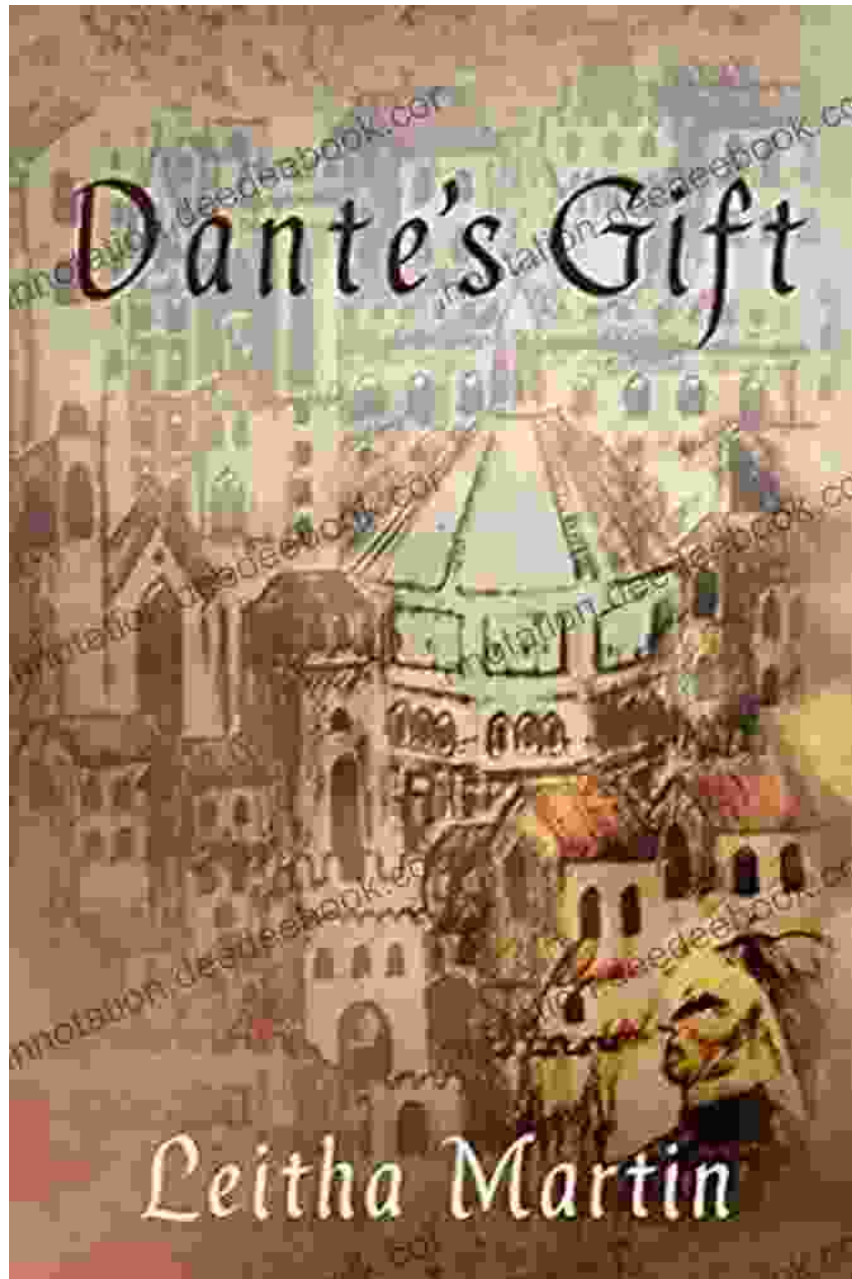
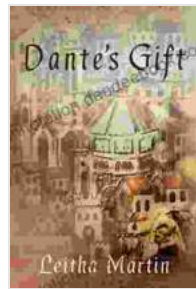


Unveiling the Legacy of Dante Gift Leitha Martin: A Pioneer in Education and Civil Rights

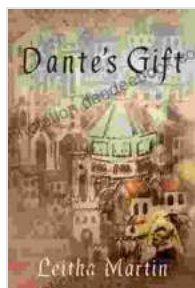
